## PROFESSOR GUSTAV BURCHARDI MEETS SOPHIA MORRISON (1910)

Professor Gustav Burchardi, Ph.D., Berlin and Paris, the well-known German philologist, was in Peel on Tuesday last. Professor Burchardi, who is a member of the Manx Language Society, is now writing a work about the number systems in the Indo-European languages, which will appear in some months' time. He thinks the Keltic systems are of the greatest value in this department, and that the Manx number system is the most valuable of all, and is closely related to that of the Czechs and Bretons. If the Czechs too are Celts, that throws fresh light on Bohemianism! The Professor had an interview with Miss Morrison when in Peel.
